Dear Taxpayer:

Full payment of this tax bill, without penalty, is required by August 15, 2016. It is not anticipated the tax payment deadline will be extended. Partial payments cannot be accepted.

Full payment of your 2016 summer tax bill may be made by the following convenient methods:

1. In the return envelope, enclosed with your tax bill. **Please return only the Treasurer's copy of your tax bill with your check.** Your cancelled check will be your receipt.
2. In person at the Dearborn Heights City Hall, Monday through Thursday, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Bring the entire tax bill with you.
3. After hours payments, made by check, can be dropped into the Night Deposit on the right side of the front door entrance to City Hall.
4. At any of the Dearborn Heights branches of Dearborn Federal Savings Bank.
5. On the Treasurer page of the City's website www.ci.dearborn-heights.mi.us using a credit card or e-check. A convenience fee is added to pay in this method.

Since the enactment of Proposal A, properties qualifying as a principal residence are EXEMPT from the school operating tax. See inside for detailed information.

The administration fee, allowable under the General Property Tax Act, is 1% in 2016. This amount is specified at the bottom of your tax bill.

By city charter, my responsibility as your City Treasurer is to collect and invest all tax monies and properly allocate and disburse these funds to the appropriate authorities.

TAX BILL CODE KEY

1. Percent of Taxable Value which is EXEMPT from school operating millage. For example, rental homes and commercial properties should show “% Declared as Principal Residence: 0.” Principal Residences should show “% Declared as Principal Residence: 100.” If you feel the percent printed on your tax bill is incorrect, please call the City Assessor (313-791-3460).
2. This line shows the amount of school operating tax which is EXEMPT due to your principal residence status.
3. City operating monies and debt payments. The total millage rate is 18.1323 mills.
4. Public Safety: voted on by residents in 1974 to provide additional millage exclusively for police and fire protection. The millage rate is 1.9916 mills.
5. Library: On Nov. 5, 2013 the voters approved an additional .95 mill increase to fund the City Libraries. With the Nov. 2, 1999 voter-approved levy, the total 2016 levy for libraries is 1.8609 mills.
6. Wayne County Operating Tax is 5.6483 mills.
7. State Education Tax is 6 mills in 2016.
8. School Operating Monies. This annual 18 mill rate (or less depending on school district) is divided half on this summer bill and half on the winter bill. 100% Principal Residence properties are EXEMPT from this tax.
9. School Debt: rates vary per school district depending on previous debt elections held within each district. Voters in the Crestwood and District #7 School Districts approved debt millage increases. These new millages will be split equally between the 2016 summer and winter tax bills.
10. Additional School Tax: **Wayne/Westland** .4961 mill on both Summer and Winter bills.
11. School Hold Harmless: **Dearborn School District only**. Additional millage to make up difference between state education funding and current per pupil spending.
12. Henry Ford Community College: **Dearborn School District only**. Both Summer and Winter bill will levy 2 mills.

CITY TAX

The city budget for fiscal year 2015-2016 was formally adopted May 24, 2016, by the City Council as required by our City Charter. The budget year runs from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. The balanced budget for this fiscal year is \$43,156,944 in the general fund.

SCHOOL TAX

By Council Resolution, the office of City Treasurer is required to collect 50% of your local school tax with the summer tax billing, and the remaining 50% with the winter tax billing.

NOTICE OF UNPAID TAXES FROM 2015

A notice of unpaid 2015 taxes on the front of your tax bill means that on March 1st, all or part of your 2015 taxes were returned as delinquent to the County for collection purposes.
