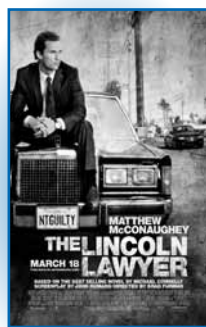

#### Civics and Citizenship Toolkit now available for checkout at the Caroline Kennedy Library

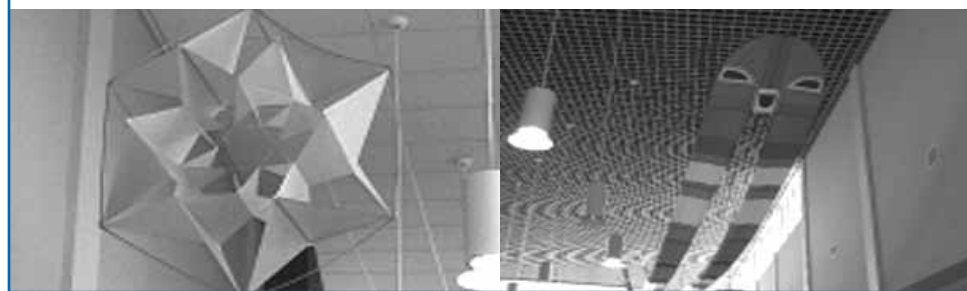

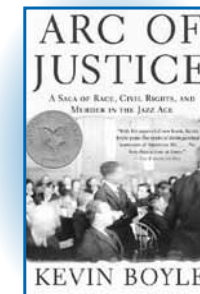

## Twilight Saga Movie Marathon

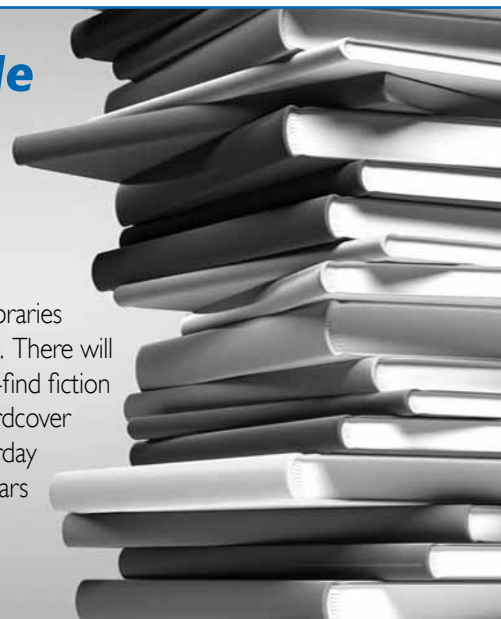
Saturday, November 5

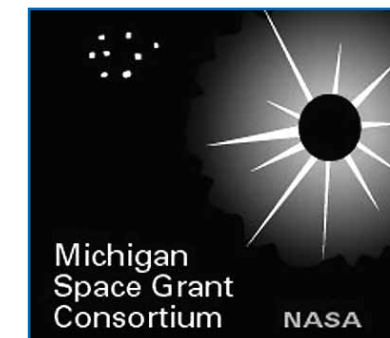
