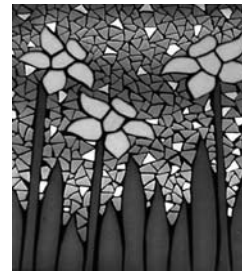

## HOME-BOUND MEALS

Home-bound Meals are distributed to approximately 150 people during the noon-time, Monday thru Friday. Menus are available at the Berwyn and Eton Senior Center. If you are in need of this service please call either center.

## EMERGENCY CELL PHONE PROGRAM

A Knox Box is a box that hangs over your outside door. The box is locked up with your house key in it. The Dearborn Heights Fire Department Emergency Unit is the only one that has a key to the box. If you have a medical emergency and are not able to open the door, they will open it with the key, instead of knocking down the door. You can purchase a Knox Box or you may qualify for a free one. 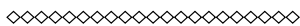
